The Class Representatives are contacting you because you have filed an EEO complaint, which has been subsumed or you provided a declaration, which was used in the certification brief filed in this case.

We have been contacted by class members who allege they have suffered retaliation. Those class members have alleged retaliation in the following manners; (1) the Agency has inappropriately removed their EEO complaint from abeyance, or (2) the Agency has taken an adverse personnel action against them.

We have filed a motion for sanctions against the Agency for these actions. After a telephonic hearing was held with the Administrative Judge, the EEOC ordered the Agency to stop taking case out of abeyance. The EEOC also granted us a hearing to determine if the Agency has retaliated against a putative class member. If you have been contacted by the Agency's EEO Office for any reason or believe that you have suffered retaliation because you participated in this case, please contact us immediately.
